Daria Gamulina's captivating paintings explore fashion's power to tell a story. Rendered with exquisite detail, her works often feature cropped views of subjects' outfits, highlighting accessories and linen patterns. Trained in scenography and costume design, Gamulina investigates how individuals select clothing and embellishment to reveal and perform themselves.

Drawing inspiration from vintage fashion magazines, look books, newsstands, and cinema, Gamulina observes fragments of costumes on her canvases, offering tantalizing glimpses into the lives of her subjects. Through this narrative approach, Gamulina invites viewers to project and interpret the aspirations of her subjects, creating a compelling tension between presence and absence—suggesting human elements and implying bodies, yet an absence of specific identity.

Daria Gamulina (b. 1987, Dnipro, Ukraine) is currently pursuing her MA in Painting and Performing Arts at Central Saint Martins College in London, following her BFA in Costume Design from St. Petersburg Stieglitz State Academy of Art and Design. Her work has been featured in exhibitions at Carpenters Workshop Gallery, Paris, France; ITMO State University, Art & Science Course Exhibition, St. Petersburg, Russia; The Center of Mikhail Shemyakin, "Drop of Water," St. Petersburg; Berthold Centre, St. Petersburg; Carrousel du Louvre, Paris; and Rupla Gallery, Helsinki, Finland.
